In some respects, it's hard to wrap my head around the fact that KAHfH will be building its 80th home in just a few months........80 homes since 1992. And yet, it's not so unbelievable. When as many fine folks as we have in our Kearney community come together, we can accomplish so much!

2017 was another very special year in the life of KAHfH. We celebrated 25 years of building homes with and for God's people in need; we built three more homes; we logged over 350 different volunteers; we logged over 9,500 hours of volunteer activity. I'd say that was a pretty good year. In addition, let me note that our Habitat Homeowners contributed \$141,591.75 in taxes in 2017. That's because the Habitat homes' assessed valuation is \$9,033,320! This has all happened because of faithful

volunteers and donors. Without the cadre of people involved in KAHfH, this wouldn't have happened.

2018 promises to be as good as well. We will again be building on the Marlatt Addition and will also see some construction activity going on as we plan to have infrastructure started on our second addition.


