God @ the Center: Remembering Our Mission of Putting God's Love into Action



Over the past two years, Habitat for Humanity International has pushed an initiative that they call "Keeping God @ the Center". I haven't pursued the initiative as much as I would have liked, but I turned there when searching for a message for this season's newsletter. I am so glad that I did, because this is the best thing that Habitat can do to fulfill our mission and vision. It's so easy to get caught up in the thousands of little tasks that must be done to select families, organize volunteers, and build houses. At times we cannot see the forest for the trees. During these moments it is important to remember our roots. Our collective devotion and faithfulness to answer the call and put God's love into action is what makes all of this possible.

You're probably aware that our affiliate tithes 10% of donations back to International for the building of homes abroad. This has been done since our founding in 1992. Last year I got a phone call from Habitat International in which they asked me what our affiliate's secret of success was. The sense that I got from them is that consistent tithing is not the norm for affiliates across the country. At the time, I didn't know what to say. My response included statements about

the quality of board members and other volunteers, the tireless work of our fundraising committee, and the penny-pinching "Fix it don't buy a new one!" attitudes of Jim and Jerry (which of course we need and appreciate). While these factors are of course important, they miss the mark.

Our secret to success isn't a secret at all. We are blessed. We answer the call and seek to love our neighbors as Jesus commands us. We do this entirely as volunteers. Not a single board or committee member expects any form of compensation other than the friendships built and the satisfaction of being faithful to God in the building of His kingdom right here and now. I am a firm believer that God blesses those who are faithful, and that is why we have been able to build 82 homes and still tithe back to Habitat International.

Thank you to all those who faithfully sacrifice so much of their time, effort, and money to make this possible. My time working with you has been the best lesson of living one's faith that I have ever experienced, and my hope is that through faith we can continue to build homes for and with God's people in need.

Building a house with Habitat requires hard work and dedication

KEARNEY — Aaron Williams and his wife Chelsea Smith are delighted with their new Habitat for Humanity home, but they're realistic about the hard work and fiscal responsibility they had to do to get it.



"We were spending upwards of \$800 a month on rent for apartments, and we realized we could apply that same amount to a mortgage," Smith said. "We knew we could afford it."

But when the couple applied for a Habitat house three years ago, they had too much student-loan debt to qualify. Undaunted, they set a goal. During the next three years, they paid off their student loans. In late summer 2017, when they applied for a house again, Habitat accepted them.

First, they were required to put in 20 hours of what's called "sweat equity" by helping volunteers finish the three Habitat houses under construction in the fall of 2017.

In April 2018, when work on their house began, the couple was required to put in 400 hours of labor. That included 250 hours of their own effort and 150 hours from family and friends. Smith painted inside walls while Williams, who does maintenance at Grandview Apartments in Kearney, used his expertise on dozens of tasks.

"My husband is handy, and they put him to work," Smith said. "We had a part in everything."

In mid December, 2018 they moved into their new house. It has a living room, a spacious kitchen, a bathroom and bedrooms for themselves and their three sons: 5-year-old twins Aaron and Anthony, and baby Abel. They have a small yard for their dog, too.

"It's really going well," Smith said. "The kids love it." The couple still is unpacking a few items, but they've hung pictures on the walls and are settling in. "It's absolutely worth it if you're willing to put in the work and the commitment," she said. "We are thankful."
